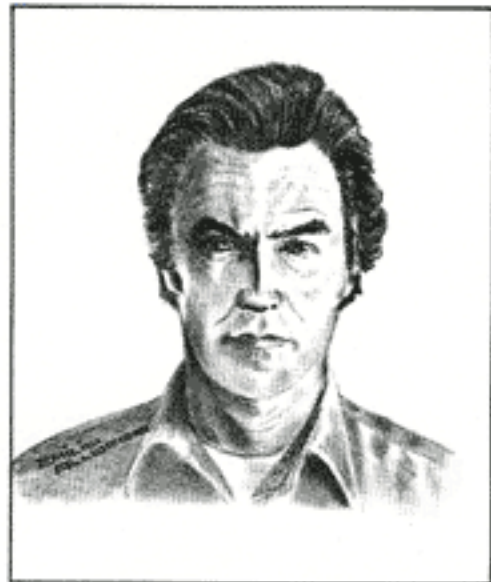


AMERICA THE GREATEST®

Clint Eastwood was a poor child whose family constantly moved through California as his father sought work in a depression-scarred economy. Clint was graduated from Oakland Technical High School, and went to work in Oregon as a lumberjack. He was drafted into the Army in 1951, and after his two-year hitch, attended Los Angeles City College under the GI Bill. While attending college, a friend who was a cameraman at Universal Studios persuaded Clint to take a screen test, which landed him a contract. After a year and a half at Universal and numerous bit parts, they let him go. Unemployed for a while, he then worked as a lifeguard and laborer. His big break came in 1958, while he was having coffee with a friend in the C.B.S. television studios cafeteria. The casting director for the T.V. series Rawhide, who was having difficulty finding an actor for the part of Rowdy Yates, spotted Eastwood and gave him the part. For the next seven years Eastwood worked steadily in the Rawhide series. During his 1964 vacation from the series, Clint went to Europe and, at the request of Italian movie maker, Sergio Leone, made three low budget spaghetti westerns: "A Fistfull of Dollars," "For a Few Dollars More," and "The Good, The Bad, and The Ugly." These three pictures made Clint Eastwood immensely popular in Europe and America, and served as the springboard which catapulted him to the success he enjoys today.
