Although Howard Cosell was born in North Carolina, he grew up in Brooklyn. He attended Brooklyn's public schools and was graduated from Alexander Hamilton High School, an honor student, track star, and sports editor of the school newspaper. He made Phi Beta Kappa in New York University as an English major, and was editor of the New York University Law Review. During World War II he served in the United States Army Transportation Corps.; following the war he opened his law practice at 30 Broad Street in Manhattan. In 1953, through an attorney friend, Theodore Kneel, Howard began doing a weekly Saturday morning radio public service program for A.B.C. during which Little League baseball players would ask questions of professional ball players. For three years Howard did this show without pay, enjoying every moment of it. He was hooked! in 1956, he gave up his law practice and signed full time as a sportscaster with A.B.C.
